Alhamdulillah, as a regular feature of this gathering, this year a new set of posters and trailers were on display that were specially prepared for this gathering by Dr Yahya and Mrs Zainab Mubashar. All the information displayed was researched and verified. The highlights were valuable contribution of Muslims in the field of Education during the golden times of Islamic civilization. The trailers of latest movies and songs which promote the message of Islam were prepared by Dr Mubashar. Special written permissions were obtained from 20th Century Fox, Matmedia productions and Awakening for the trailers of movies, "Kingdom of Heaven", "Al-Gazali: Alchemist of Happiness" and two music videos of songs by famous nasheed artist Sami Yusuf respectively. The detailed information about these trailers, songs and artist were also displayed in the exhibition. Kingdom of Heaven is already available in the Torbay Islamic Centre and Al-Gazali: Alchemist of Happiness is also now donated there by Mrs Zainab Mubashar. The titles of the posters on display were "Our Schools", "Islamic Art" and "Turkish Baths and Dr Brighton". Two unique books were also on display namely "Muslim Heritage in our world – 1001 inventions" and "Palaces and Mosques".



Children Activities

Before lunch, Ozzy D and Cosmo-The Clown were the centre of attraction for children. They both entertained the children with interactive games and circus skills activities. Although they initially planned to involve the children between the ages of 5-14 years into the activities, but more interestingly younger children joined in as well and the two bouncy castles that were arranged for children under 5 years, remained vacant for most of the time during the event. Mr Ozzy D and Cosmo-The Clown deserve special credit for keeping the children occupied for 1 ½ hours before lunch, while adults and young people had time to informally meet and greet each other and explore the exhibition and sales stall. Their antics lightened the day and warmed the crowd for a surprise youth stage show.
