The first two sessions commenced with six representatives from different faiths and beliefs introducing the topics. The audience, inspired by these presentations, formed small discussion groups to explore the issues from their own perspectives. The groups' key reflections were finally shared with the whole audience.

- **'God or No God that is the Question!'** explored the increasing division between religion and atheism.
- **'Facing Contemporary Challenges to Faith'** raised concerns that Faiths need to address.
  - 'Faith in the Future' focused on the faith of young people in Devon.

Representatives brought the thoughts of their small discussion groups to share with the full audience. Lively exchanges had taken place.

#### Comments included:
